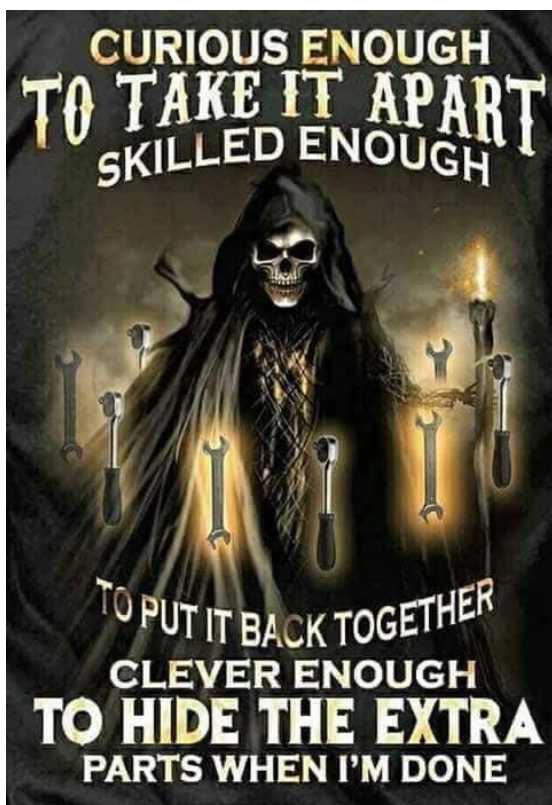

The boys were part of a group of 3000 youngsters from NSW, with a total of 10,000 scouts and their leaders attending the Jamboree at Tallim Bend, South Australia, earlier this month.

The boys — Harry Haynes, Harry Taylor, James McNamara and Jack Koschel — took part in a whole range of activities including mud runs, ice skating, shooting and crate stacking.

Finley 1st Scout Group leader Noel Cardwell said it was 10 days of non-stop fun for the boys.

"They had a great time and were very well behaved," he said.

"These jamborees generally only come up once during their time as a scout, so knowing it will most likely be their only time, they took full advantage.

"It's a really good social opportunity for the young ones.

Mr Cardwell also celebrated his birthday during the jamboree and was required by the other leaders to wear a blue wig for 24 hours.

"It was all a bit of fun, just like wearing a hat," he joked.

Scouts Australia hosts the jamboree every three years with the next one scheduled for 2022 in Victoria.

The first jamboree in Australia was held in Frankston in 1934 and was attended by Scouts founder Robert Baden-Powell.
