THE GOOD WORD ON INSURANCE

As Peter said, we have highlighted some of the issues that could arise at rallies. Here are just a couple of the highlights of your insurance:

• Volunteers Cover - NHMA maintains a volunteers insurance policy for both it, and its member clubs. This insurance provides a range of benefits for volunteers injured whilst working at an event for NHMA or a member club.

• Committee Cover - is Professional Indemnity for Directors and Officers.

• Transporting our equipment to rallies - our policy covers members equipment whilst it is being loaded, transported, and unloaded, to and from a rally.

• Can we have trailer rides? - Yes, but the Rally Coordinator has to carry out a risk assessment to identify the risks and mitigating actions associated with this activity.

• Are non-NHMA Associated Clubs welcome at NHMA Club Rallies? - Yes, we encourage all heritage machinery groups to participate. The only proviso is that they supply a copy of their club's Certificate of Insurance, as we would do at their events.

• Is there a place where all this

information is readily available? – Yes, the Rally Handbook and Safety Management System document is available on the NHMA website: https://nhma.com.au/ wp1/wp-content/uploads/2024/01/ NHMA-Rally-Handbook-V4.0-January-2024.pdf

These are just the highlights; we recommend all members of NHMA member clubs have a read through the Rally Handbook to dig deeper into these highlights. There is plenty of useful information to help make your rally a fun, safe place to be.
