On our Scotia Trek we visited Nialla Lake on The Anabranch as the crop was coming off. Leon Wittwer put these notes together. Thanks Leon.

Visit to Nialla Lake

Niallla Lake is on the propertyWillow Point Station-situated east of the Silver City Highway in New South Wales. The lake is one of many which are on the flood plain of the Darling River Anabranch.

The area was totally inundated during the 2022/23 flood event and plans were made to plant cereal crops when the water subsided.

The lake is 1200 hectares (3000acres) and was prepared for planting in March 2024, and seeded in May/June 2024. 400ha.was planted for hay, and the balance for grain, seed grain and milling grain.

The milling grain is trucked to a mill at Smeaton near Ballarat Victoria for processing to various types of cereal food. The hay and seed are sold to some private farmers, and some under contract to several companies.

The crop is not irrigated, nor has it had any significant rainfall during the growing season, there is sufficient residual moisture in the soil from the flooding, and this has resulted in excellent yields, some of the crop standing up to 1.4m in height!

To prevent wind damage flattening some of the oat crop or shaking the grain from the heads a machine known as a windrower is used to to cut the stalks just above ground level and leave the crop on the ground in windrows and then harvested with a conventional harvester.

The property is owned by Gus and Kellie Whyte and family and the farming operation with the Harmer family as share farmers.

The two daughters were in charge of the John Deere harvester and the "chase tractor and bin"

In Gus's opinion the girls are easier on the machinery than most male drivers!
